1. The Courtyard

Dubbed 'the flagship bar and restaurant at the University of York', The Courtyard is THE place to eat on campus. Situated within Derwent College, this L-Shaped bar and restaurant is always buzzing with activity, serving the most amazing burgers and pizzas well into the evening. Oh and they all happen to be INCREDIBLY cheap too.



2. The Glasshouse

The Courtyard's little brother, The Glasshouse is the hub of activity on Heslington East.
